"Memorials"

Many of us have heard of stories (or even experienced ourselves) finding something from the past that has significant meaning or even has change the trajectory of the future for someone.

I have read stories of family members finding letters left by their loved one that cleared up past questions the family had about them. Stories of money and valuables left for heirs that no one knew about. Significant money that changed the future of the family.

I read a story not long ago of a family Bible that when opened after the death of a loved one, inside they found specific passages that were written down that pointed, over and over again, to salvation in the Lord. One of the children read those passages and by the leading of the Holy Spirit, came to faith in Jesus Christ. My cousins, my Aunt Opal's children, found notations in her Bible that blessed their heart.

Memorials! We tend to look at them in many different ways. We put up memorial stones in a cemetery or on a columbarium wall to take note of our loved ones whose remains were place there. There is certainly nothing wrong with that. When I have a chance, I visit my mom and dad's gravesite. Looking at the headstones, their names, birth and death dates, my mind is flooded with memories, my heart is full!

We have memorials in taking pictures. Most of us have pictures around the house of family members, or even our family gathered for a special occasion. Again, as we see those pictures, memories flood our hearts. Many carry around pictures in their billfold or pocketbooks so that they can show them to others. We say, "Look, this is was my grandson getting his attendance award last week." Most are proud moments, some others note heartbreaks or sad moments in our life.

I posted a picture on Facebook of our dog Sadie that we had to put down last week. While the picture was a reminder of her beauty and devotion for almost 14 years, it was sad too, because we miss her presence in our life. Memorials remind us of the past, flooding our hearts and minds with certain feelings.

Our country has created memorials in our nation's capital to remind us of individuals, Lincoln, Washington, Jefferson, and of our nation's history, WWII Memorial, Vietnam Memorial. You can go to the Smithsonian and see past documents that give a picture of the past that shaped the future.

God works in this manner too. In the Old Testament, the heroes of Scripture left monuments behind to remind upcoming generations of God's faithfulness. Here are just a few examples. God give the two tablets with the Ten Commandments to Moses on the mountain to bring down and show the Israelites. Those tablets were placed in the Ark of the Covenant that God had them carry before them as they moved through the desert, as a sign of God's faithfulness. As the Israelites crossed the Jordan into the Promised Land, Joshua left 12 memorial stones as a reminder of God's faithfulness and the promise that was fulfilled.

As Christians, we use the Cross of Christ as a reminder of His sacrifice for us. Most Christian churches have a cross somewhere. Many wear a cross around their neck or on their wrist, or as a tattoo, to signify that they belong to Christ.

What if we thought about leaving a memorial to future generations? What if our churches thought about, "How can we impact future generations for Christ by leaving them something to remind them of GOD'S faithfulness?"

For the church, our memorials to God may come in the form of ministries that impact our community or missions around the world. Our memorial my be a picture of a youth that came to Christ and was baptized, and now serves the Lord as a pastor or Christian leader.

For us individually, our memorial may be a letter left to read telling what Jesus meant to us or how the Holy Spirit helped/ led us through difficult periods of our life. It may be a worn Bible with notes in the margin and words of God's faithfulness over the years.

Here is the deal folks. We all leave some type of memorial behind. Everyone! Secular and Sacred! How that looks is different for everyone. But, for the young adults, you can start planning now of how you might impact future generations/ family/friends. For those of us who are a little closer to our life expectancy, if we haven't yet, we might want to think about a memorial that will impact the future of those we love, and maybe even those we don't know.

I've been told before that if you never shoot at the target, you will never hit the bullseye. I believe that to be true. God uses His historic Word to tell us about Himself, His Son, and His Spirit and how the past, what He has already done, can effect your and my life and our future TODAY. Maybe we should do the same.
