"The Surrendered Life"

Today starts the second week of Lent. Last Wednesday was Ash Wednesday (March 2nd) and has traditionally marked a beginning of a time of self-examination and a time of preparation in a growing faith in Jesus Christ. We closed our Ash Wednesday service with singing "I Surrender All" If you have forgotten the lyrics, here they are:

All to Jesus I surrender, All to Him I freely give; I will ever love and trust Him, In His presence daily live.

Refrain:

I surrender all, I surrender all; All to Thee, my blessed Savior, I surrender all.

All to Jesus I surrender, Humbly at His feet I bow; Worldly pleasures all forsaken, Take me, Jesus, take me now.

All to Jesus I surrender, Make me, Savior, wholly Thine; Let me feel the Holy Spirit, Truly know that Thou art mine.

All to Jesus I surrender, Lord, I give myself to Thee; Fill me with Thy love and power, Let Thy blessing fall on me.

All to Jesus I surrender, Now I feel the sacred flame; Oh, the joy of full salvation! Glory, glory, to His Name!

At HOPE Church Raleigh I often mention the need for us to surrender all. For us to take a look at what we are holding back, holding on to, trying to keep from the Lord. Yesterday morning I was reading Oswald Chambers "My Upmost for His Highest" and while I knew there may be some of you that read that devotional daily, Chambers nails the idea of surrender, so I wanted to share. So if you read this yesterday, please read it again with fresh eyes. If for the first time, listen to what Chambers says about surrender.

The Surrendered Life

Galatians 2:20 I HAVE BEEN CRUCIFIED WITH CHRIST...

To become one with Jesus Christ, a person must be willing not only to give up sin, but also to surrender his whole way of looking at things. Being born again by the Spirit of God means that we must first be willing to let go before we can grasp something else. The first thing we must surrender is all of our pretense or deceit. What our Lord wants us to present to Him is not our goodness, honesty, or our efforts to do better, but real solid sin. Actually, that is all He can take from us. And what He gives us in exchange for our sin is real solid righteousness. But we must surrender all pretense that we are anything, and give up all our claims of even being worthy of God's consideration.

Once we have done that, the Spirit of God will show us what we need to surrender next. Along each step of this process, we will have to give up our claims to our rights to ourselves. Are we willing to surrender our grasp on all that we possess, our desires, and everything else in our lives? Are we ready to be identified with the death of Jesus Christ?

We will suffer a sharp painful disillusionment before we fully surrender. When people really see themselves as the Lord sees them, it is not the terribly offensive sins of the flesh that shock them, but the awful nature of the pride of their own hearts opposing Jesus Christ. When they see themselves in the light of the Lord, the shame, horror, and desperate conviction hit home for them.

If you are faced with the question of whether or not to surrender, make a determination to go on through the crisis, surrendering all that you have and all that you are to Him. And God will then equip you to do all that He requires of you.

Folks, I have to examine myself daily. This world presses in on me all the time. I have to ask myself: Am I doing all God has called me to do? Have my conversations been wholesome? Have my thoughts been pure? There is a hard one, right? While we should examine ourselves daily all year, Lent is certainly a time to remind us of that fact.

You and I need to ponder this question today; Have I surrendered all to Jesus?
