"Passing It On!"

"Hey, look at this." Diane's words brought me out of driving-mode as we headed down the road to celebrate grandson number five's 1st birthday. I had to wait till I stopped at the next traffic light to catch a glimpse of the picture she had on her phone. "Do you know who these people are," she asked? The light changed and I started moving. The picture swirled in my mind and, as it has done untold numbers of times, the brain did its thing. Personally, I know that if this recall does not happen within several seconds it's just not coming. But, I began to recognize it.

The image was of two men walking away from the camera. Both are dressed in suits. One is taller and much younger than the other. The elder man carries a broad-brimmed hat behind him, and they appear to be in a deep conversation. "Yes," I declared, "I do know this picture." The image was taken in 1961 and recorded the meeting of former President Dwight David Eisenhower and his successor, John F. Kennedy. One, a five-star general and Commander of the combined military forces in the European theater during the Dday invasion to retake Europe from Germany in World War II. The other, Commander of the Naval vessel PT-109 stationed in the Pacific. Eisenhower who had led the allied forces to victory on the battlefield and who was picked to lead the nation during the uncertainty of post war nuclear build-up and the beginning of the cold war, and Kennedy, who came from American aristocracy and was the youngest man to ever be elected president. One, the time tested, battle-hardened war horse; the other, the young, well-heeled and connected stallion ready for the race. In his inaugural address, Kennedy would state that the torch had been passed to a new generation of Americans.

We pulled up to the house and went inside where the party was in full swing. Although other families with their children were there, my focus was upon the Six: Oliver, Jude, Lincoln, Baylor, Thatcher and of course the birthday boy, Theo. All of the party items were in place. Presents and treats, hamburgers and hot dogs, cake and snacks, Pepsi and lemonade. Playing outside and the inside and all had a great time. I wouldn't say anything very deep was discussed. There were no World changing ideas shared, but time is spent together. And when we left after several hours I felt that the day was well spent. It reminds me once again that love is not spelled L-O-V-E but T-I-M-E.

We must help them that they might help others for one day God will release the torch from us that we might pass on to them. The choice is ours. We can either whither on the vine as aged fruit or by the renewing power of Jesus Christ proclaim loudly to this generation that He is Lord yesterday, today and forever.
