"Take a Good Look Ahead"

Some of you may have chickens or maybe grew up where there were chickens around. We had chickens where I grew up. Being the youngest, I had to feed the chickens and gather the eggs everyday. Most of you have seen a chicken coup even if you have not raised them. The chicken coup, which is basically a wire cage, often has boxes in it. They are closed in on the top and bottom and three sides. There is usually a half piece of board on the front to keep the straw from coming out so that in the box the hens can nest and lay their eggs. Everyday I would go into the chicken coup and reach my hand into the nest inside the box and gather all the eggs that had been laid since the day before.

One day I was gathering the eggs and reached into the nest inside the box and felt something wrap around my hand. I jerked my hand out of the box and a chicken snake had wrapped himself around my hand. It had gotten into the pen, into the nest box and was eating the eggs.

I shook may hand and arm, as hard as I could to get the snake off of me. Yes, I know a chicken snake is not poisonous. But that didn't matter to me. My life long outlook on snakes has been a dead snake is the best snake. I have been cropping tobacco and picked up a copperhead with the leaves in my arms. I have killed a rattle snake on our farm that his head touched the front of our truck with an eight foot bed and with the tailgate down (an additional 2 feet) the rattles hung off the tailgate. My Aunt Opal was bitten by a copperhead. My dad was chased by a black runner snake. And this is only the tip of the iceberg when it comes to my run ins with snakes. Do I need to say again how much I hate snakes. Oh, and by the way, when I shook that chicken snake off my hand, I had to go into the house and change my pants, if you know what I mean.

I could not see into the nest box that day. I knew that there were supposed to be eggs in there, but it never crossed my mind that I might have needed to be concerned about a snake. The chicken box was dark inside, hard to see in, so on faith that I would find what I was looking for, eggs, I reached my hand into the nest.

It seems that many in our society day are doing the same thing. They are blindly reaching out (their life) into things they believe are safe, they believe are beneficial for them, thinking they will find what they are looking for, but blindly get hold of something they

didn't expect, something that is a detriment to them. In fact, society tells them, "Oh, don't worry. It's all good! It's safe! It's fun! Just enjoy!" When in reality, there is some BAD stuff out there.

What would happen if we all lived our life, instead of blindly listening to others, the world, or Satan, and would use the lens of scripture and Jesus to guide our decisions? Would there be some bumps in the road (life)? Yes, I would say so. But I can guarantee you that the end result would be good. The ultimate result would be good. The long lasting, forever result would be perfect. It really seems like a no brainer, right? What if, instead of decisions that are a detriment to your health, your future, for eternity, you were to surrender all things to Jesus and live for eternity with Him?

Listen to Romans 10:8 - 10: "But what does it say?
