"The Light vs The Dim & The Dark"

At the end of February last year, I retired from full-time work with the hospital system I have worked with since 2012. Since then, I have continued to work part-time (10-20 hours per week) on special projects for the same finance team I had worked with all those years. I am fortunate to be able to do that mostly remotely in the upstairs of my home, and I try to do most of those hours in the mornings and up until about 1PM on the days that I work. I have always been a person who prefers light, which for me at home, even during the day, includes blinds open and some (not all) lights turned on. Light has always been a comfort to me, and it makes me feel more aware and energetic. The nature of light helps us to see clearly, as it exposes and it highlights. Many days when I come downstairs after completing my "work hours", I find my hubby in what I call "the dim & the dark". It has become a regular part of our daily routine on days that I work for me to come downstairs and mention "the dim & the dark" to Bill, and then go about turning on some lights and opening up closed blinds.

Currently, on Wednesday nights at Hope Church after Pastor Marty feeds us, he is going over the "I am" statements of Jesus found in scripture. This past Wednesday he focused on John 8:12 - "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life". Marty had placed candles on each of our tables which he later had us light before he turned out all of the lights. The candles represented Jesus being the light of the world, and we discussed the effects of the light from the candles on our darkened room. At that point my mind squirreled to thinking of my term "the dim & the dark" and how, in addition to Jesus himself being the light of the world, God's Word also provides light in order for us to know and understand God. God's Word lights up our darkness through the knowledge we gain, providing a way for us to not just simply exist in "the dim & the dark". We know The Bible, which our sweet granddaughter Cameron referred to one day as "The Jesus", is truly God's inspired word. In it He tells us about himself, about how much He loves us, and what He promises to us once we come to know Jesus as our Lord and Savior. It provides us with answers to our questions and explains how we are to live our lives and handle our blessings, as well as the trials and

tribulations that we face in this fallen world, until the days we will be with Him in eternity. And, as we were reminded this past Sunday as we looked at Matthew 6:9-13 ("The Lord's Prayer"), God's Word even gives us an example of how we should pray.

It appears to me that, as we grow more and more in our Christian faith and are transformed through the indwelling Holy Spirit, we are naturally drawn more and more to be in God's Word. By His grace, we do not have to experience life this side of heaven in "the dim & the dark". And in response to that grace, we are called to also be lights in the darkness – "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven" Matthew 5:16.

During this Lenten season, we at Hope Church Raleigh have been asked to read scripture and focus our prayers on some specific topics. So far, we have been asked to pray about forgiveness, loving well and wisdom. We have been given some specific scripture verses to reflect on regarding these topics and have been asked to individually pray about them as they relate to our church, ourselves and others God puts on our hearts. We have a few more weeks to go until Easter, with additional topics to study and pray about.

As we continue to open God's Word and ponder on it during this Lenten season, and beyond, I pray that God will continue to enlighten us so that we can better be lights in this world that reflect the Light of Christ!
