"Active Faith"

In a recent Youth Sunday school class, we talked about the concept of Active (vs. Passive) Faith. Active faith is basically proving your faith in God by living out that faith in your own life. Walking the walk, instead of just talking the talk, so to speak.

Ray Pritchard said, in his article The Fifth Law: Active Faith Releases God's Power: "True faith is never passive. True faith moves us to act, to do, to try, to build, to attempt, to expand, to say 'no' to sin and 'yes' to righteousness, to join, to speak out, to move forward, to dare to dream beyond our means, and to walk around Jericho again and again until at last 'the walls come tumblin' down.' Faith is 'outrageous trust in God.' 'Outrageous trust' is what you have when you build an ark hundreds of miles from any body of water. 'Outrageous trust' compels you to leave your home not knowing where you are going. And 'outrageous trust' sends you into the Elah Valley to face Goliath."

Now would be a good time to go to your Bible and read lames 2: 14-26 and Hebrews 11 & 12.

Let's add to this list: Esther, Job, Shadrach (Hananiah), Meshach (Mishael), and Abednego (Azariah). I'm sure you can think of others... of the Bible, historical figures, or in your own lifetime.

Charles Spurgeon, speaking on Job 13:15, said "In speaking on this text I would note, first, THAT FAITH IS THE HABITUAL GRACE OF THE CHRISTIAN. To trust in God is his usual mode of life. He does not sometimes trust and sometimes cease to trust; but "the just shall live by faith." Faith is not a grace of luxury but a grace of necessity. We must have it, and if we do not have it, we would not be the people of God at all. The common habit of the Christian then, is a habit of trusting. The Christian's walk is faith, and his life is faith."

While reading online, I found this quote from an article by Kim Sullivan: "So often, the English language equates faith with the word 'believe'. The problem with this definition is that believing is not nearly as concrete as faith. Belief often remains on the sidelines as a spectator, while faith requires action. Being faithful means adhering to the truth, having fidelity to what is most important in reality. Although one

must believe in order to have faith, faith is not required to believe." (Dead or Alive?: Cultivating Active Faith from familyfire.com)

My parents live in a very small town (population about 900) named Reynolds, which is in the middle part of the state of Georgia. They attend what is now called Trinity Church, a non-denominational church. About a month ago, Trinity Church had its first worship service as a new church, after being a Methodist church (first Methodist Episcopal, then United Methodist) since 1870. My dad was born in Reynolds and grew up in the Reynolds UMC. The majority of the Reynolds UMC members stepped out in faith, led by their belief in the authority of God's word, and formed a new church. They don't have a pastor yet, but they will. In the meanwhile, they have preachers lined up for months to come, and their congregation is growing. God rewards the faithful.
