"Decision Making Has Consequences."

I was walking out to check the mail at the church last week and I noticed a gentlemen driving his car on the wrong side of Green Road. He had turned off of Millbrook Road on the wrong side and was driving towards Spring Forest Road. Cars coming from the Spring Forest side were scattering left and right so that they would not be hit by this "wrong way driver." He seemed quite happy and didn't seem to be upset with the situation. He just went on down the street and turned onto Spring Forest Rd. and went on his merry way.

When I was in high school, one summer, I worked in North Myrtle Beach at a hotel. I had driven to Tabor City to see some friends and was driving back down to the beach late one night. I was on US Highway 9 heading into Cherry Grove Beach about to crossover the Inland Coastal Waterway bridge when I noticed headlights coming up the bridge from the other direction on my side. My first thought was "No Way!", but yes, there was a car on my side of the bridge!.

As you know, when crossing a bridge there is no shoulder (most often) to pull over on, just one or two lanes. Thank goodness there are two lanes in each direction on that bridge over the waterway. I started flashing my lights as he came toward me and slowing my speed. He was swerving from one lane to the other, still at highway speed. As he got closer, I decided that I would swerve opposite of him as he closed in, hoping he would miss me. He did! I looked in my rearview mirror seeing him travel on down the road, of course, still on the wrong side.

These two "wrong way drivers" did not cause an accident, thank goodness, but that is not always the case. My wife, Terry's, brother-in-law and his family were not as fortunate. A number of years ago they were driving to Florida for vacation. They were both pastors in the United Methodist Church. They had their 3 kids with them. It was in the evening late and they were about to crossover one of the rivers on I-95 in Georgia and a drunk driver was coming in the opposite direction. On this night there was a tragic accident. The drunk man hit Jan's minivan and the van caught on fire. Jan's wife and 3 children were killed in the accident. Jan lived!

The man was arrested and charged. Of course the excuse was "I didn't mean to do it. It was the alcohol." But the court convicted of "4 counts of vehicle manslaughter."

We all make choices everyday. Some can have grave consequences if poorly made, others not so much. But in our culture today, when we make a poor decision, we often defer to an excuse for our actions. When I was growing up as child, you would hear the phrase, "The Devil made me do it." Today it is, "He or she caused me to do it."

Here is the thing, very seldom do we make choices without knowing the cost. For example, there are signs everywhere, "Do Not Enter" or "Wrong Way", telling us that this is not the way. You might say, "But people that drink and drive cannot process that." True! BUT, we are told over and over again not to drink and drive. There are advertisements on TV everyday. The bartenders are told, don't over serve alcohol and to watch for those who are drunk. We know better than to drink and drive, but some say, "I'm not drunk. I can drive" and then ...

As believers we have the Holy Spirit that guides us (when we listen to Him). We have no excuses. As a believer in Jesus Christ, He has given us His Spirit to lead us in the right direction and to make the proper choices that are right and good, to lean on. Trying to go it "our way" often doesn't work out too well. But when we seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in all things in our life, "right decisions" become easier and we find ourselves not having to make excuses.

In Luke 21:36 Jesus says, "But keep on the alert at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are about to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man." In Mark 13:33 Jesus says, "Take heed, keep on the alert; for you do not know when the appointed time will come."

We are to stay alert in ALL circumstances of life. Life comes at us fast and furious and our decision making has consequences. Make no excuses, but rely on the Holy Spirit to lead you. God's way and will is still perfect.
