# "Anyone For Calvary?"

A touching legend tells us that when Jesus was a boy in Nazareth He met a Roman boy by the name of Fidus, who conveyed this desire: "I am looking for Joseph, the carpenter. From him I want to learn the arts of his craft."

"I can lead you to him," answered Jesus, "for I am called the Son of Joseph."

As Fidus watched and learned from Joseph, Jesus told him of a great King who would one day be raised upon a throne so high that all the world would see.

Fidus exclaimed: "Would that I might build the exalted throne of the great King!" "Fidus" said Jesus, "you will be the one to build the throne of the great King, the throne from which He shall rule the nations. I promise you."

Years passed, Fidus went home to Jaffa and practiced his trade with honor. He happened to return to Jerusalem on a day when the Jewish capital was in an uproar. He could hear cries of "Crucify Him! He makes Himself a King."

As he passed the gate of Pilate's palace, a Roman soldier who knew the skill of Fidus greeted him: "You are especially welcome, Fidus. Three are to be crucified today, and only two crosses are prepared."

Fidus was assigned the task. He put all his skill into its making, and viewed his finished product with pride. Later he followed the crowd outside the town and up a hill. He heard a voice, a voice he could never forget. Looking closely he saw a figure, a figure he could never forget. Yes, it was the Boy of Nazareth, now a Man, but writhing in agony on the "throne" Fidus had made. His eyes were opened.

Can you imagine what went through Fidus' mind at that moment. How his heart would feel. Little did Fidus know, while Jesus would proclaim "It is Finished" from that cross and die, "It was finished", but He was not. Jesus would also conquer death and rise again. And for all who believe, the work on the cross by Jesus Christ and the empty tomb three days later provides the HOPE we have, that being, eternal life in Jesus name.

You see, whether you know it or not, you and I (Believer) were dropped off at Calvary.

The story is told of a town that had an elevated railway. One of the stations was near a great burial ground. Calvary

Cemetery was its name. For many years, because in that part of town there were many more dead than living folks, the train did not stop at the cemetery except on request. Just after leaving the nearest station, the guard would open the door and say, "Next station is Calvary. Brian stops on signal only. Anybody for Calvary?

It is a parable of life's train. At all the other stations the train would stop. At Market Street, at School Street, at University Avenue, at Main Street, and Vanity Fair, at Broadway, and Church Street, with no special notice. But to get off at Calvary, that means a choice and an expressed desire.

Jesus provides the way. Jesus' Spirit, the Holy Spirit calls. Our part of the equation is to be obedient and answer the call. Yes, God knows everyone who He calls and will save. He is sovereign. But will we pass by Calvary for a time to do our thing, live our life, enjoy the temptations of this world? Or will we shout out, when the call comes "Anyone for Calvary" and say "YES! I want to go to Calvary"?

Acts 2:21 "And it shall be that everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." We only call upon His name if only He has truly called us.

If you have never heard the call "Anyone for Calvary?", then you have never made the stop. If you have heard the call, but never answered, don't wait. Say, "I want to stop at Calvary and kneel before my Lord and confess my sins and ask Him into my heart." If you have done that, then this week, called Holy Week, has special meaning to you. Don't let this week pass by without thanking Jesus for your Salvation in His name. And bow before Him and worship like you never have before.

Oh, I am so glad I got off at Calvary when I did. Jesus continues to ask — "Anyone else for Calvary?"
