"To the Question of 'What is the Bible?"

Last Sunday we began our quest to explore 20 questions that every Christian should understand. Please consider what follows as you remember *the four step process of biblical change* that was introduced. Please pray that God would <u>teach</u> us and <u>show</u> us our faults, so that He might <u>correct</u> us and <u>train</u> us unto righteousness. Complete...Equipped...Engaged.

The Bible as God's Word

- 1. **Inspiration**: This affirms that the Bible is inspired by God Himself. It teaches that the Holy Spirit guided the human authors in such a way that they wrote exactly what God intended without error (2 Timothy 3:16-17, 2 Peter 1:21). This divine inspiration extends to every part of Scripture, from historical narratives to moral teachings and theological doctrines.
- 2. **Authority**: The Bible holds ultimate authority in matters of faith and practice for us. It serves as the standard by which all beliefs and actions are measured (Psalm 119:105, Isaiah 40:8). The authority of Scripture is not dependent on human approval or interpretation but on its divine origin and inherent truth.
- 3. **Clarity**: Reformed theology teaches the clarity (or perspicuity) of Scripture, meaning that the essential teachings necessary for salvation and Christian living are clear and understandable to ordinary believers under the guidance of the Holy Spirit (Psalm 19:7-8, 2 Timothy 3:15-17).
- 4. **Sufficiency**: The Bible is considered sufficient for all matters of faith and practice. It contains everything necessary for salvation and living a godly life (Psalm 19:7-11, 2 Timothy 3:15-17). While God continues to work through His Spirit and the Church, <u>Scripture alone</u> is sufficient as the authoritative revelation of His will.
- 5. **Interpretation**: Reformed theology emphasizes the importance of interpreting Scripture according to its intended meaning, taking into account its historical, cultural, and literary context. This approach seeks to understand Scripture in light of Scripture itself, with the help of the Holy Spirit and in community with the Church (2 Peter 1:20-21).

Application in Reformed Practice

Therefore, the Bible holds a central place in worship, preaching, teaching, and personal devotion. It is read, studied, and applied to guide believers in their understanding of God, His purposes, and His will for their lives. Reformed theologians and pastors prioritize expository preaching—systematically explaining and applying Scripture—to ensure that congregations are grounded in the truth of God's Word.

Conclusion

For us, the Bible is not merely a collection of religious writings but the living and active Word of God (Hebrews 4:12). It is through Scripture that God reveals Himself, His redemptive plan, and His will for humanity.

As such, studying and adhering to the teachings of Scripture are essential for spiritual growth, doctrinal clarity, and faithful living according to God's design.

So, "What is the Bible?" - The Bible is the inspired, authoritative, clear, sufficient, and interpretable Word of God, essential for knowing Him and living in accordance with His divine purposes. Thus, the truth of the Scriptures MUST be applied to EVERY question that will be considered as it should be to ALL that we do.
